Education Regulation 189a provides the right for School Governing Councils to determine the School Dress Code Policy. The following policy was passed by the School Governing Council in 2020.

## We believe that a School Dress Code:

- contributes to a sense of unity and pride in our school
- contributes to the development of a supportive school environment by reducing the levels of competitive dressing
- increases the safety of students both in the school and on excursions
- increases the profile of the school in the wider community
- is cost effective with a choice of affordable clothing

## Girls Summer/Winter

- Dress: blue and white check (plain navy stockings/leggings accepted)
- Skirt/Skort: plain navy (plain navy stockings/leggings accepted)
- Shorts: plain navy blue (no logo, stripes etc / appropriate length / not ripped or frayed)
- Pants: plain navy blue pant or tracksuit pant (no denim, no logo, no stripes, not ripped or frayed etc)
- Polo shirt: red and white polo shirt, monogrammed with school logo (are available for purchase at school)
- Hooded jumper: red, monogrammed with school logo (are available for purchase at school)
- Socks: plain short white, black or navy


## Boys Summer/Winter

- Shorts: plain navy blue (no logo, stripes etc / appropriate length / not ripped or frayed)
- Pants: plain navy blue tracksuit pants (no denim, no logo, no stripes, not ripped or frayed etc)
- Polo shirt: red and white polo shirt, monogrammed with school logo (are available for purchase at school)
- Hooded jumper: red, monogrammed with school logo (are available for purchase at school)
- Socks: plain short white, black or navy

Note - a white long sleeve top can be worn as an undergarment, but a hooded school jumper is preferable.

## Footwear

- fully enclosed shoes (no sandals)


## House Sports Day Uniform

- Shorts: navy running shorts. (minimal logo preferred)
- Trackpants: plain navy (minimal logo preferred)
- Shirt: house colour t-shirt or polo shirt
- Shoes: sports shoes/sneakers (students will not be able to participate without shoes)

Hats

- Navy bucket ( 7 cm brim) wide brimmed (available for purchase at school)

During Terms 1 and 4 our school enforces a "No Hat, No Play" rule. We expect students to wear a school hat to protect them from the sun.

## Jewellery, makeup and other accessories:

- Earrings: only studs or sleepers for pierced ears and no other piercings are permitted, any other piercings must be covered at all times. No other jewellery is permitted.
- Make-up: no make-up is to be worn at school, this includes nail polish (end of year school concert is accepted)
- Accessories: all jackets, scarves, hair accessories etc must be based upon the school colours, of plain navy or red. Jackets, scarves, beanies and gloves may be worn when outdoors in during Term 2 and 3.

## CONSEQUENCES FOR NON-COMPLIANCE

The Department for Education makes it clear that non-compliance is not serious enough to deny access to learning. Consequently, suspension is not permitted. However, schools are allowed to implement a range of other measures to encourage compliance, including restrictions within the yard, yard service and sitting out.

## Steps for non-compliance:

- If a student is unable to comply with the Robe Primary School Uniform Policy for a short period of time, due to circumstances beyond their control, a written note of explanation from the parent/carer to the class teacher is required and appreciated.
- If a note is not supplied, the teacher will remind the student about our school uniform, hand out a reminder slip and ask them to wear the correct school uniform the following day.
- If the child returns again in the incorrect uniform the parent/carer will be contacted by the class teacher.
- If the child continues to wear incorrect uniform the principal will contact the parent/carer.
