Students have been introduced to an online typing program to support them in developing efficient key board skills. Kids practice after Spelling Mastery for about 10/15 minutes a day. We are hoping this will support them in their composition of texts.













Parent/Teacher Learning Discussions

Our formal Learning Discussions will occur in week 9, on Wednesday March 27, from 3:30–7:00pm. However, individual teachers will reach out about other times during this week that they will be available to meet if required. These sessions will focus on teachers sharing how children have settled into their new classrooms, strengths and possible areas for development. It is also an opportunity for parents/carers to share any information that will contribute to the overall well-being of their children.

Staff Roles for 2024

- Penny Day is teaching our Reception children.
- Jane Hayes is teaching our Year 1/2 class, as well as being our Curriculum Coordinator.
- Luke Wise is teaching our Year 2/3 class.
- Kylie Johns is teaching our Year 4/5 class.
- Kimberley Austin is teaching our Year 5/6 class 4 days and Anne Grayson teaching 1 day.
- Tom Wachtel is working 4 days this year (M, T, Th, F) as our NIT teacher and our sports coordinator, with a focus on PE & Health, Literacy and HASS.
- Tom will also be relieving Jane so she can fulfil her Curriculum Coordinator role. In this role, Jane is responsible for: General administration, Cystic Fibrosis support, student services and staff professional learning with Bright Path.
- Nat Boulden will be releasing teachers for NIT on Thursday and Friday by taking their classes for science and is also our Well-Being Coordinator and Autism Inclusion Teacher for 2024.
- Cassie Bermingham Finance Manager Supervisor of Student Support Officers (SSO's)
- Jodi Keane School Administration/Student Intervention
- Georgie Sneath, Stacey Wirth, Mardi Brooks, Lisa Maczkowiack & Lashay Semple our very valued SSO's

This year we have 82 students attending Robe Primary School. 12 new reception students have joined our school – 6 are from first time families – that is no older siblings currently attend our school.

Mid-Year intake – we welcome another 11 Reception children in July, 2024

Site Improvement Plan

SIP priorities will stay focused on reading comprehension & vocabulary as our major goal, with writing our 2nd target. This continued focus is about going deep and narrow to ensure that growth and change is sustainable. We will maintain a focus on 'stretching' all kids so that each and every one reaches their full potential as readers and writers.

We will also maintain and strengthen our focus and use of Learning Intentions and Success Criteria (LISC) to make the learning destination visible and formative assessment to regularly 'check in' to see how children are travelling with their learning. This continues to play an integral role in day-to-day teaching and learning. Our 2024 Professional Learning overview will reflect these priorities.

Our professional learning focus each Tuesday afternoon and the subsequent Pupil Free Days will continue to deepen teachers understanding and inform more intentional teaching in both reading and writing through the use of LISC and goal setting.

This is our fourth year of Initialit - a systematic program that ensures the consistent and intentional teaching of early literacy behaviours - such as phonemic awareness, rhyme, syllabification, onset & rime and phonics. Children have been grouped depending on their individual needs. These groups meet for 45 minutes a day and are run by Jane Hayes, Penny Day and Stacey Wirth.

We will continue with Spelling Mastery for our Year 3 -6 students (and a few Year 2 students who have exceeded Initialit content). Children have also been grouped depending on their individual needs and each group meets for 30 minutes – 10:15 – 10:45 am – and then participate in an online typing program from 10:45 – 11am. These are run by Kylie Johns, Luke Wise, Kimberley Austin, myself (Wednesdays) as well as Mardi Brooks and Lashay Semple. This ensures that each group of children receives targeted spelling instruction and content.

Professional Learning & Pupil Free Days (PFD)

This year we will continue developing our expertise in Learning Intentions, Success Criteria and formative assessment within reading and writing. We have secured the services of Shane Crawford, a consultant that has been working with our SECAV partnership and comes highly recommended. Shane will work closely with myself and educators to fine tune and move our professional learning forward.

The following PFD and/or school closure days have been approved by Governing Council. The last 3 dates also align with Kingston Community School to support families with children attending both sites:

- PFD Term 2, week 3 Friday May 17
- PFD Term 3, week 3 Friday August 9
- School Closure Day Term 3, week 7 Friday September 6 to coincide with the Adelaide Show.
- PFD Term 3, week 8 Monday September 9
- PFD Term 4, week 6 Monday November 18

Quality Start Program

Our 'Quality Start Program' for this year is about zoning in on a single strength of character - kindness. Our theme is 'Choose kind - each and every time. If nothing nice to say, saying nothing is fine!'

Teachers have also been developing children's understanding about a growth mindset through their individual strengths and being kind with words and actions, and how to identify and use these ideas for their own personal wellbeing, as well as contributing to a safe, kind and happy learning environment. Children have been participating in various activities to strengthen their understanding of kindness – including team building sessions, reflecting on being kind and completing a kindness diary daily, as well as meditation and mindfulness activities. Thank you to Miss Boulden for her time and dedication in planning this unit – sharing ideas, activities and resources with the staff to ensure that we have a shared commitment to a quality start to 2024!

The program ran in week 1 and 2 and culminated in open classrooms and a sausage sizzle. Thanks Chris and Mardi for your help in preparation and organisation on the day, much appreciated!

A huge thank you to Tegan Allwright who provided all our kids with some very active fitness sessions during our 'Quality Start' program.

School Fees

Our 2024 fee structure, as approved by Governing Council, is \$287 per student, the \$100 government rebate will be automatically applied, this is the last year it is being offered. This covers all their anticipated textbooks and pens/pencils, photocopying and other stationery/I.C.T. requirements for the year. All families/carers should have received a detailed invoice regarding the payment of this year's school fees. Fees are due by the end of term 1. The fees support our school in providing your children with the tools to be active and engaged in their learning. Your diligence and support in this matter is sincerely appreciated – thank you.

2024 School Card

If you require financial assistance, you may be eligible for this scheme. Please refer to the link on our Facebook page. Applications preferably can be submitted online but if you would like support to fill out the forms, please come in and see our Finance Officer. Deadlines required by State Government must be met in a timely matter. We are more than happy to assist you with this process.

Volunteers and Signing In

Parents/carers and volunteers who are visiting our school for any 'extended' length of time are required to sign in electronically and wear one of our visitors badges (both of these items are positioned at our front office counter). The requirement is part of our Child Protection Policy, as well as knowing who is on site in case of an emergency. Thanks for your co-operation in this matter.

Late Roll Arrivals & Early Departures

If a child is late to school and the teacher has marked the roll book, the child MUST check in with the front office and see Jodi or Cassie to receive a late slip and take it back to their class teacher.

If children need to leave school early due to being unwell, a medical appointment or for family reasons etc., it is of great importance and the parent/carers responsibility to come into the front office and sign your child in/out. Thank you.

Late Pick Ups

If you will be late in picking up your child please contact the office directly rather than the class teacher. This will ensure the information is received and shared at the appropriate time. Text messages on teacher's phones are often read AFTER the day has ended.
