

SITE IMPROVEMENT PLAN (SIP) GOALS FOR 2024

GOAL 1: If we design a learning environment that values agency and explicitly teach for comprehension, we will see students become more effective learners and improve student engagement and achievement in reading.

Target: Every learner to show growth in their reading development, evidenced by our triangulated data of Initialit progress monitoring, PM Benchmark data, Professional teacher judgement and/or movement on the reading progressions.

GOAL 2: If we build teacher capacity to increase student agency in the process of writing, we will improve students' engagement and achievement in writing.

Target: Every learner to show growth in their writing development, evidenced by our triangulated data of Brightpath assessment data, movement on the writing progressions and/or teacher professional judgement.

SA CURRICULUM - AN UPDATE

The <u>SA Curriculum for public education</u> has been adapted from the <u>Australian Curriculum version 9</u> for a South Australian context. It is based on <u>our strategy for public education</u>, international and national research, along with the collective insight and expertise of local teachers.

The new South Australian Curriculum framework outlines the essential knowledge, capabilities and dispositions in each learning area, retaining the Australian Curriculum content descriptions and showing how these contribute to the learning of higher-level concepts.'



'We want to nurture and empower all our learners with the knowledge, skills and capabilities they need to become fulfilled individuals, active, compassionate citizens and lifelong learners.

Timelines

The new South Australian Curriculum for public education will have a flexible implementation over a 3-year period.

2024 - explore and engage

All schools explore the SA Curriculum, taking part in familiarisation activities to decide their approach.

2025 to 2026 - activate in context

All schools engage with the SA Curriculum: Mathematics and enact other learning areas according to local priorities. Schools activate their plan and increase their level of engagement towards full adoption.

2027 - full adoption

All schools will make the shift to using the SA Curriculum to design, teach, assess and report in all learning areas at all year levels.

PARENTS & FRIENDS










SAPSASA GOLF
