#### **KINDY TRANSITION 2024**

Our Kindy transition program was a great success as usual and we have lots of little people very excited about attending 'big school'. A huge thank you to Penny Day and Sami from Kindy for their organisation and supervision for another successful transition program – much appreciated.

#### 2025 CLASSES

We have been discussing class formations for 2025 – this is always a complex process and we try and look at each model thoroughly to best meet the needs of the children in our care. Unfortunately, we lose our RAAP funding and this means we drop down to 4 classes, as well as decreased hours for SSO support. Class sizes will increase significantly in 2025 – we will go from average 19 students to 24/26 or more students per class. All these factors play a role in our organisation of teacher and SSO placement as well as make up of classrooms.

Parents/carers and children will find out their class teacher for 2025 on Monday when we do transition activities to help prepare for 2025 and to help develop connections and/or build on relationships.

An email will be sent to families on Monday indicating classes/staffing for 2025.


